Ballot Proposals

Proposition 120 Defeated by a Landslide Margin

Humane Voters of Arizona recommended a NO Vote on Proposition 120, which was defeated by a landslide margin of 68% to 32% (as of Nov. 20th). Prop 120 was referred to the ballot by the Arizona Legislature, asserting “state sovereignty” over federal public lands in Arizona, and establishing exclusive authority and jurisdiction over air, water, public lands, and wildlife in the state. If enacted, this unconstitutional and extreme measure could have had a devastating impact on wildlife and habitat.
